See the Pinnacle of the Temple and the Shofar Sounder site and the many mikvahs that prepared those who ascended with sacrifices.</p> <p>Free time</p> <p>Ben Yehuda Market</p> <p>*David Tower Night Spectacular sound and light show (optional): The wall of David's citadel become the stage for a nighttime show celebrating Jerusalem's 4,000 - year-old history through virtual reality images telling the stories of King David and so on. Inspiring and breathtaking feast of the senses.</p>		
<p>Day8 8/10 Thursday</p>	<p>Mt. Olive: Enjoy the Panoramic view of Jerusalem and its surrounding area, including Kidron Valley and the Eastern Gate. This is the site of Messiah's ascension and return.</p> <p>Church of All Nations: Overlooking the valley of Jehoshaphat, locating of the judgement of nations concerning their treatment of Israel. Joel 3:2, 12.</p> <p>Palm Sunday Path to Garden of Gethsemane: Prayer Garden with its ancient olive trees. Where Jesus prayed the night of His betrayal by Judas and arrest.</p> <p>City of David: The foundation of Jerusalem where King David had his palace and Israel's kings were anointed.</p> <p>Hezekiah's Tunnel: Part of Jerusalem's water system, is located under the City of David. It connects the Gihon Spring—Jerusalem's fresh water supply—with <u>the Siloam Pool</u>. According to 2 Chronicles 32:2-4 and 2 Kings 20:20, this tunnel was dug during the reign of <u>King Hezekiah of Judah</u> to prepare Jerusalem for the imminent attack of the <u>Assyrian king, Sennacherib</u>. In the Bible, <u>Hezekiah</u> redirected the water through old and newly dug Jerusalem tunnels.</p> <p>Pool of Shiloam: According to the <u>Gospel of John</u>, Jesus</p>	<p>Lunch on own</p>	<p>Ramada Jerusalem</p>

	<p>sent "<u>a man blind from birth</u>" to the pool in order to complete his healing. As a freshwater reservoir, the pool would have been a major gathering place for ancient Jews making religious pilgrimages to the city.</p> <p>Pilgrim Road: Newly excavated path from Pool of Siloam to the Temple.</p> <p>Garden Tomb (Communion): See Golgotta and enter the tomb where Jesus rose from the grave. Celebrate Messiah's resurrection with a Communion Service.</p> <p>House of Caiaphas & St. Peter Gallicantu (maybe): House of Jerusalem's high priest where Jesus stood trial and was denied three times by Peter before His death. Visit the dungeon where HE was lowered into the pit and jail cells where Peter and John were imprisoned for Preaching the Gospel.</p> <p>Upper Room, David's tomb: Site of last supper, a Passover seder, and location of early church.</p> <p>Friends' of Zion Museum: History of Christian support and patriarch in the return and restoration of the Jewish People back to their Promised Land and Zion. Honors the Righteous Among the Gentiles.</p> <p>Yad Vashem (*Holocaust Survivor sharing): Holocaust Memorial Museum to the six million Jewish people murdered in the Holocaust during World War II. Discover danger signs so you will not be silent and prevent a reoccurrence of this tragedy—"Never Again".</p>

View the copper mines of King Solomon and the impressive landscape formations.</p> <p>Eilat city tour (on Bus)</p> <p>Underwater observation park: Walk through the underwater, glass tunnels allow you to view red sea tropical fish and the colorful coral reefs with its marine life.</p> <p>Cross Arava border</p> <p>Wadi Rum Jeep Ride: known also as the Valley of the Moon, it is a valley cut into the sandstone and granite rock in southern Jordan. Wadi Rum has been inhabited by many human cultures since prehistoric times, with many cultures—including the Nabataeans—leaving their mark in the form of petroglyphs, inscriptions, and temple ruins. The Wadi Rum Protected Area has been a UNESCO World Heritage site since 2011. With spectacular desert landscapes and large megaliths, we see the region of Wadi Rum. Although not mentioned in the Bible, the children of Israel came through this region in the Exodus. The Bible relays that Israel came to the King of Edom and asked for safe passage. The ancient capital of Edom was Petra, just north of this great valley. One gets the sense of the landscape endured by Israel in the great Exodus from Egypt. From forty years in the wilderness they came through this region in the final leg of their great journey. The Nabataeans held a monopoly on the Frankincense trade, amassing considerable wealth from the sale of it from Petra. The Nabatean King Aretas IV is mentioned in 2 Cor. 11:32-33.</p> <p>Mt. Nebo: According to the <u>Bible (Deuteronomy)</u>, Moses ascended Mount Nebo, in the land of <u>Moab</u> (today in <u>Jordan</u>), and from there he saw the <u>Land of Canaan</u> (the <u>Promised Land</u>), which God had said he would not enter; Moses then died there.</p> <p>Magdaba: Visit the Christian Town of Madaba "The City of Mosaics". You will be visiting the St. George church with its mosaic map of the Holy Land from Byzantine times.</p> <p>Dead sea float: A unique experience, in the mineral rich water at the lowest spot on earth.</p>
